A reading from the book Exodus.

²They had journeyed from Rephidim, entered the wilderness of Sinai, and camped in the wilderness; Israel camped there in front of the mountain.³Then Moses went up to God; the Lord called to him from the mountain, saying, 'Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the Israelites:⁴You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. ⁵Now therefore, if you obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples. Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Saint Matthew.

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. ³⁶When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; ³⁸therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.'

¹⁰Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. ²These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector;

James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus;

⁴Simon the Cananaean, and Judas
Iscaiot, the one who betrayed him.

⁵ These twelve Jesus sent out with the
following instructions: 'Go nowhere
among the Gentiles, and enter no town
of the Samaritans, ⁶but go rather to the
lost sheep of the house of Israel. ⁷As you
go, proclaim the good news, "The
kingdom of heaven has come
near." ⁸Cure the sick, raise the dead,
cleanse the lepers, cast out demons.
You received without payment; give
without payment.
